

The question just given you, "**What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ?**"- Matthew 27:22, is the most important question you will ever answer. You see, how you respond to this question will not only determine how you will spend your life on this earth, but where and how you will spend it for all eternity.

Jesus is the subject of the bestselling book in the world, the Holy Bible. In the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy 18:18, God spoke to Moses of Jesus' coming to earth and of our need to obey his words. He said, "I will raise them up a Prophet from among their brethren, like unto thee, and will put my words in his mouth; and he shall speak unto them all that I shall command him. **And it shall come to pass, that whosoever will not hearken unto my words which he shall speak in my name, I will require it of him.**" And, so there would be no mistake as to whom this "Prophet" would be when he came, God gave many marvelous prophecies about his first coming, which have all been fulfilled in JESUS. One such prophecy foretold Jesus' crucifixion, a Roman death sentence, before the Roman nation was ever in power, and 1,000 years before Jesus was crucified – "...they pierced my hands and my feet." –Psalm 22:16b. When Jesus came, he spoke of our sin; and he spoke of sin's terrible consequences; but, most importantly, he spoke of the wonderful salvation God would provide to save us from our sin. Jesus' coming to earth split the history of the world into two parts – B.C. (Before Christ) and AD (Anno Domini – Year of our Lord).

"Okay", you may ask, "**What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ?**" "What does God want me to do with him?" Well, first we must understand why Jesus came. When speaking to Joseph about Jesus' birth, the angel of the Lord said of Mary, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for **he shall save his people from their sins.**" – Matthew 1:21. So this is why he came, to save us from our sins. We learn from the Bible what sin is, namely, **not achieving the perfect standard God has for us**. We have a perfect God; so, if we want to be accepted by God, and allowed into His heaven, we must meet His perfect standard. We, however, come short of this standard by doing those things that are wrong, and by not doing those things that are right. If we will be honest, we must all confess that we have come short of living a perfect and sinless life. The Bible says, "**For all have sinned, and come short...**" – Romans 3:23a. The Bible tells us that there is a penalty for sin (coming short of this perfect sinless standard); this penalty is death – the "second death". The Bible says all who are judged according to the works they did in this life, will be found to have come short, will be **rejected** by God, and will experience the second death. Listen to Revelation 20:13-14: "And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: and **they were judged every man according to their works. And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death.**" But, since we have all sinned, how can we escape this – God's judgment? Well, this is where JESUS comes in. God loves us so much, that He took on human flesh (I Timothy 3:16), and He was born into this world as our **substitute** – Yes our **substitute!** Jesus came to live the perfect sinless life for us, which we [through our disobedience] have failed to do. He was "**...in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin.**" – Hebrews 4:15. Do you see it? Do you see how it works? Jesus lived a perfect life for you, so you could get credit for it. But, not only was Jesus your substitute for a *sinless* life; he was also your substitute for a *sinful* life. God's holy law called for your *condemnation*, and justly so; but God's holy love called for your *salvation*, which He provided on the Cross. There, on the Cross, God placed your sin on JESUS. Bearing **your** sin, he was found to have "come short", and he was condemned in **your** place. Jesus' righteousness earned God's *pleasure* for you, and Jesus' death and blood earned God's *pardon* for you. Do you see it now? When Jesus was on the cross, God credited JESUS with your **sinful life**, so that He may credit you with JESUS **righteousness**

(sinless life). The Bible puts it this way, "**For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.**" – II Corinthians 5:21. God accepted JESUS' death as payment for your sin, and then He raised him from the dead to become the Judge of all men. – Acts 10:40-43. The question is, "Will you be judged according to **your** works or according to **his**?"

You may now say, "I understand this! But, '**What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ**'? How may I have this salvation for me?" You may have it by doing with Jesus what God the Father did with Jesus: God made Jesus to be your savior, and you must make Jesus to be your savior too. Agree with God (repent) about what He says about your sin, and about His Son; and believe this Good News (gospel), believing (trusting) in what JESUS has done as your only hope for heaven and forgiveness for your sins. The Bible says of Jesus, "...**that through this man is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins; And by him all that believe are justified from all things...**" – Acts 13:38-39. Friend, will you believe this Good News, and abandon your hope in everything else (but Jesus)?

"Oh," you may say, "I have been deeply religious toward Jesus." Yes, but **what have you done then with Jesus which is called Christ**? God made JESUS to be a substitute for you; just be certain you make nothing to be a substitute for JESUS. You see, though some religious things may have *their* place, none can take his. So, make sure you do not place your faith in *religious* things, and fall short of placing it in *him*. Your attempt to live a good life, taking the mass, asking Jesus "into your heart", asking God to "save you", your baptism, your priest, or even yourself – none of these can take away sins – only JESUS can do that. Therefore, you must not rest your hope in these things, but stake all your hope for Heaven in JESUS alone, who alone died as your substitute on the Cross. Friend, if you will repent, and believe only in JESUS as your savior, you cannot go to Hell. God will not require your penalty to be paid by JESUS, and then require it again from you. JESUS said, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever **believeth in him** should not perish, but have everlasting life." – John 3:16.

**What shall you do then with Jesus which is called Christ?** Remember, what you do with Jesus will determine what God shall do with you. Meet us in heaven.
